# TRAINING AND A TIME OF RENEWAL IN THE DESERT

TCM's mentoring center in Phoenix Arizona found a new home this April as TCM began utilizing the beautiful Franciscan Renewal Center in the heart of the Valley. For the first time, three cohorts joined together for fellowship, renewal, and training for the various ministries to which God has called them.

Haus Edelweiss, TCM's campus in Austria, serves as an example of servant leadership, Christian maturity, learning lifestyle, and world Christian vision that we try to emulate in all of our mentoring centers for the face-to-face portion of each class. For many TCM students in the southwest United States, this was their first experience with an academic retreat setting, which included room and board, social activities, and a worship service/ reflection time on the final night. There were 31 students in attendance for the three classes: Disciple Making Through the New Testament with Dr. Jozsef Steiner, Servant Leadership with Dr. Rick Justice, and Disciple Making with Dr. David Roadcup. Many of you have been praying for these sessions. Thank you!

We are thankful to the Franciscan Renewal Center for working with TCM in providing an affordable setting to host our hybrid model face-to-face sessions in a way that is refreshing and renewing for our students. This retreat provided an opportunity for them to engage spiritually with their professors.

Overall, the face-to-face session was a success in all respects, giving students from each cohort opportunities to share meals with one another, talk about their ministries and disciple-making methods, and take time away from daily routines and distractions to focus on theological applications for all areas of their lives. Jarred, campus pastor for one of the Christ's Church of the Valley locations, helped summarize the session best: "Everything about the retreat was better than expected... I think TCM has positioned itself in excellent standing to expand through the Phoenix, Arizona area, and other areas in the southwest U.S. I'm proud to be a part of TCM and look forward to finishing well at the end of this year. TCM will always be special to me. I will continue to be involved however I can."

# NEWS FROM UKRAINE

A very special moment happened at the TCM Regional Representatives' report meetings this May.

TCM graduate and TCM Regional Representative for Ukraine, Zhenia Siniy, gave his report. We were so blessed by his presence for graduation as most of us had not seen him away from Ukraine in more than a year. Zhenia epitomizes the man of God spoken of in Micah 6:8: "He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." His presence anywhere brings joy and light.

Zhenia and his wife Ira have remained in Ukraine to help with relief efforts to those people who have stayed in the country. His report of the work being done in Ukraine included that he and Ira have started another church in Ukraine. (He has planted more than 80 churches over the last 30 years.) This new church began in their home with four people and now exceeds more



than 100 people. Many of these are new believers. He also shared that he has dug a well on his property. Every day hundreds of people line up outside their home to receive water from this well.

What a blessing it is to know that Zhenia is serving and sharing the good news of a Lord and Savior who provides a well from which the followers of Jesus who drink from it will thirst no more.

## PRAYERFAST UPDATE

PGN? What is that? Despite being familiar with numerous acronyms from my time in corporate America, I had never heard of this acronym. After joining TCM, I soon learned PGN stood for the PrayerFast Global Network, created in 2020 to facilitate and accelerate prayer and fasting to foster a Holy Spirit movement to fulfill the Great Commission. I know from my own experience if I do not make prayer and fasting a priority, other activities will start to crowd out my time with God. Prayer and fasting have been and will continue to be essential in achieving TCM's vision, that every nation will have effective leaders of disciple-making movements.

David Wright stated in TCM's Fall 2021 report, "TCM's DNA is to pray first and keep praying through every season, every project, every circumstance, and every opportunity to give praise." This "DNA" was very apparent on my first day at the TCM office: We met at 10 a.m. to pray and I quickly learned this would be a daily occurrence, and even includes staff from other countries on Wednesdays. In John 15:5, Jesus said "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." At TCM, we know that we will accomplish what God has called us to do only if we stay in close fellowship with Him and continually seek His direction and provision for this ministry. This DNA had clearly inspired the creation of the PrayerFast Global Network back in 2020.

PrayerFast has continued to grow each year since its inception. For example, the Boiler Room Experience was introduced last November at the International Conference on Missions ("ICOM") in Columbus,
Ohio. The Boiler Room

of the conference. TCM plans to continue the Boiler Room Experience at future ICOMs to provide the opportunity for many others to join us in prayer for a world that desperately needs Jesus.

Pastor Shodankeh Johnson led the participants in prayer asking God to send a revival and to raise up more workers for the harvest. Many of the participants had also fasted leading up to this incredible prayer event.

We look forward to what God is going to do through this year's PrayerFast event to be held on November 11, 2023. Please mark your calendars for this prayer gathering that will be conducted as a virtual meeting to allow for broad participation. Stay tuned for additional details as well as other opportunities to celebrate prayer and fasting with us. In the meantime, please continue to pray and fast for TCM's mission of training Christian leaders for significant service.

## THE PRESIDENT'S OUTLOOK

### All glory to Him!

Work started two years ago on the Assurance Argument. We asked Him for a good result. Higher Learning Commission Accreditation (HLC) is

an important global recognition for our graduates to use to impact their churches, cultures, and countries for Christ more effectively.

And He came through BIG TIME! As part of our ten-year reaffirmation review process, we prepared and submitted an Assurance Argument demonstrating with narrative and evidence that TCM fully met the criteria (five criteria divided into 18 subcriteria). Led by Rick Justice and Sara Fudge with help from many other personnel, our team culminated a ten-year effort to strengthen and improve our educational program by gathering evidence, writing the argument, and then submitting a 150-page document with close to 330 pieces of evidence to HLC in early February 2023. A peer review team of five individuals from various institutions reviewed the documents and visited both the Haus Edelweiss and Indianapolis locations to interview our Board, Executive Leadership Team, administration, faculty, staff, and students in mid-March 2023.

In early April, we received the peer review team's final report. I am pleased to announce that TCM met all five criteria, all 18 sub-criteria, and received a reaffirmation of accreditation for another ten-year cycle! The report was the most complimentary we have ever received and concluded with this statement:

"TCM International Institute is an institution that is deeply committed to its mission, and the team would like to acknowledge that this was apparent in every interaction with campus stakeholders. The institution's primary strength is its deep and abiding commitment to its mission and providing a positive and uplifting learning environment for its students."

Please join us in thanking God for His grace toward TCM throughout this process. His guidance and loving kindness were apparent in so many ways throughout. All glory to Him!

Board Member Tom Tanner summed up nicely our concluding comments by quoting 2 Chronicles 14:1: "...and the land had rest for ten years."
